Start To Graduation Support



Every student enrolled online is assigned a dedicated team providing one-on-one support. They are your partners who can help you manage your time and ensure you're meeting degree requirements to get you to graduation.

Enrollment Services Advisor

Student Success Coordinator

Three Start Dates Per Year

- We offer three (3) start dates per year: Spring (January), Summer (May), & Fall (August)
- Each semester is between 13 and 15 weeks in length

Part-Time vs. Full-Time Options

- Part-Time: 6-9 credit hours
- Full-Time: 12 or more credit hours
- The average ECE student enrolls in courses part-time, taking between 6 and 9 credit hours per semester.

- High school diploma or GED.
- No ACT or SAT scores required.
- Open admission if transferring from another institution.

Key Considerations

- Associate Degree Scholarship.
- All courses apply towards the online ECE bachelor degree.
- Apply CDA from UC or another preparation program to receive college credit towards degree.
- T.E.A.C.H. Scholarship available.

Bachelor Degree

Early Childhood Education Birth – Age 5

Qualifications

- 2.5 GPA if transferring from another institution or continuing at UC.
- No ACT or SAT scores required.

Key Considerations

- T.E.A.C.H. Scholarship available.
- Apply up to 90 credits from previous coursework towards program.

Who is a good fit?

- Those interested in the knowledge base and dispositions needed to work in early childhood programs that focus on nature, for example:
 - Nature-Center Preschools
 - Zoo Schools
 - Forest Schools
- Those seeking ways to use greened-up playgrounds, playscapes, and nearby greenspaces with young children.

This sub-plan includes five curriculum methods courses and one practicum course.



Ours is the FIRST program in the country to offer a sub-plan dedicated to nature-based early learning.

Practicum | How Does it Work?



How long is practicum?

- Infant & Toddler: 1 semester- 10 hours/week
- Preschool: 2 semesters- 1st Semester: 10 hours/week; 2nd semester: 15 hours/week
- Nature-Based Early Learning: 1 semester- 10 hours/week

Can I do my practicum where I work?

- Yes! If the center is highly rated or accredited.

Can I get paid while doing my practicum?

- Yes!

Does practicum lead to a Professional Teaching License?

- Only the Pre-School practicum can lead to the Ohio PreK Associate License
- **This program **does not** lead to the PreK – Grade 5 Professional Teaching License**

Admission Requirements



First-Year Student

- Never attended college.
- Open admission with high school diploma or GED.

Required Application Documents

- Send official high school transcripts or GED to UC Office of Admissions.
- Do not email or fax transcripts.
- No test scores are required.
- Complete the free online application.

Transfer Student

- Attended another institution.
- Open admission for Associate program.
- Required 2.5 college GPA if applying for the Bachelor's program.

Required Application Documents

- No test scores are required.
- Complete the free online application.
- Send official high school and college transcripts to UC Office of Admissions.
- High school transcripts could be waived.

Transfer Students



Transfer Your College Credits Into Our Early Childhood Education Programs

- Students can earn transfer credits for coursework taken at regionally accredited colleges and universities.
- Potential to apply up to:
 - 40 credits from previous coursework towards the Associate's program
 - 90 credits from previous coursework towards the Bachelor's program
- Students who have completed their CDA Credential, can earn 6 credit hours toward their degree
- To determine what credits will transfer, you must [apply](#) to the program, once you are admitted, you will submit a petition for transfer of credits to be applied towards your degree.

Articulation Partnerships

- UC has articulation agreements set up with over 15 community & technical college partners.
- Students admitted to the Bachelor's program coming from a partner institution will be granted automatic transfer of credit from their Associate's degree towards the Bachelor's program.

Financial Aid



- Both degrees are eligible for federal financial aid (FAFSA).
- You must be enrolled in at least six (6) credit hours per semester to be eligible for FAFSA.
- If you are eligible for military benefits, please contact your regional VA Representative to determine if your benefits will cover the program.
- Tuition payment plans are available.
- Unique financial support offered by OCCRRA to early childhood educators in Ohio.

OCCRRA | T.E.A.C.H. Scholarship



Eligibility

- Type B Family Child Care Provider, Type A Family Child Care Provider, or teacher, assistant teacher, director, or owner employed in a licensed early care and learning program.
- Work at least 30 hours per week with children.
- Agree to commit to staying at the program for a minimum of one year after completing scholarship.
- Employer (Sponsor) must be located within Ohio, but Scholar may live elsewhere.

Support

- Pays for 90% of tuition and fees.
- Pays for 80% of book costs.
- \$100 per semester for internet/travel.
- Reimbursement of \$12 per hour to the sponsor, for providing up 6 hours per week of paid release time.
- \$300 bonus every year at least 9 credits are successfully completed.
- One-time computer/laptop reimbursement for college degree scholarships of up to \$1,500.
